# Covid-19

## Access limits in Italy

In accordance with the most recent Italian legislation (**DPCM August 7, 2020**), actually there are the following possibilities entering in Italy.

- A) crew of means of transport or travelling personnel.
- B) entry into Italy from San Marino or the Vatican City State.
- C) entry into Italy for work reasons regulated by special safety protocols, approved by the competent health authority.
- D) entry into Italy from one of the following countries (without stays or transits, in the last 14 days, in countries other than the following): Austria, Belgium, Cyprus, Denmark, Estonia, Finland, France, Germany, Ireland, Latvia, Lithuania, Luxembourg, Netherlands, Poland, Portugal, Czech Republic, Slovakia, Slovenia, Sweden, Hungary, Iceland, Liechtenstein, Norway, Switzerland, Andorra, Monaco, United Kingdom;
- E) Entry into Italy after having stayed or transited, in the last 14 days, in one of the following countries: Croatia, Greece, Malta, Spain. In this case the following alternative prevention measures apply:
  - obligation to present the attestation that they have undergone a molecular or antigenic test, carried out by means of a swab and with a negative result, within 72 hours prior to entering the national territory;
  - the obligation to undergo a molecular or antigenic test, to be carried out by means of a swab, upon arrival at the airport, port or border location, where possible, or within 48 hours of entry into the national territory at the local health company of reference.

## Access limits in Italy

### If none of the above match...

If you have not transited or stayed, in the 14 days prior to entering Italy, in one of the following Countries: Armenia, Bahrain, Bangladesh, Bosnia Herzegovina, Brazil, Bulgaria, Chile, Colombia, Kuwait, Macedonia-Northern Macedonia, Moldova, Oman, Panama, Peru, Dominican Republic, Kosovo, Montenegro, Romania, Serbia, there are the following possibilities:

G) need to enter Italy for reasons of work, health or absolute urgency and for a maximum duration of 120 hours;

H) transit through the national territory to return to your country of residence or stay (maximum permitted duration of stay in Italy: 36 hours);

I) entry into Italy, for proven reasons of work, by citizens or residents of one of the countries (circle the Country of citizenship or residence): Italy, San Marino, Vatican City State, Austria, Belgium, Cyprus, Croatia, Czech Republic, Denmark, Estonia, Finland, France, Germany, Greece, Hungary, Ireland, Latvia, Lithuania, Luxembourg, Malta, Netherlands, Poland, Portugal, Slovakia, Slovenia, Spain, Sweden, Iceland, Liechtenstein, Norway, Switzerland, United Kingdom, Andorra, Monaco, Bulgaria, Romania, Australia, Canada, Georgia, Japan, New Zealand, Rwanda, Republic of Korea, Thailand, Tunisia, Uruguay

L) health personnel entering Italy for the exercise of health professional qualifications, including the temporary exercise referred to in Article 13 of Decree Law no. 18 of 17 March 2020;

M) cross-border workers entering Italy for proven reasons of work or to return to their residence or stay;

N) personnel of companies with registered or secondary headquarters in Italy returning to Italy for proven work needs and after a stay abroad of no more than 120 hours;

O) officials and other servants, however they may be called, of the European Union or international organisations, diplomatic agents, administrative and technical staff of diplomatic missions, officials and consular officers, military personnel in the performance of their duties;

P) pupils and students attending a course of study in a State other than their State of residence or stay, to which they return every day or at least once a week;

### If none of the above match...

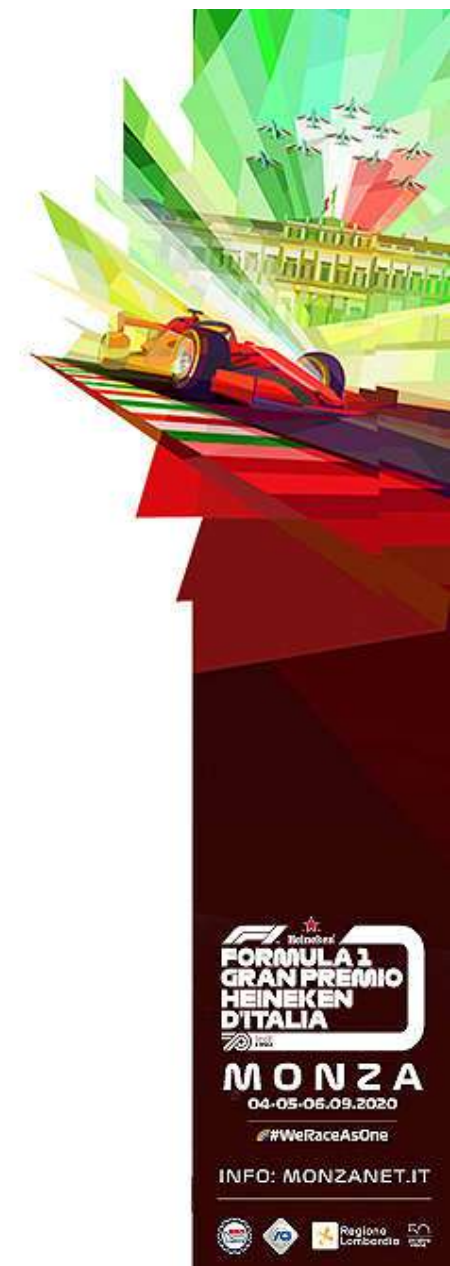
R) citizen of one of the following countries (Italy, San Marino, Vatican City State, Austria, Belgium, Cyprus, Croatia, Czech Republic, Denmark, Estonia, Finland, France, Germany, Greece, Hungary, Ireland, Latvia, Lithuania, Luxembourg, Malta, Netherlands, Poland, Portugal, Slovakia, Slovenia, Spain, Sweden, Iceland, Liechtenstein, Norway, Switzerland, United Kingdom, Andorra, Principato di Monaco, Bulgaria, Romania), resident in Italy (from before July 9 for those who have stayed or transited, in the last 14 days, from Armenia, Bahrain, Bangladesh, Bosnia Herzegovina, Brazil, Ci-le, Kuwait, North Macedonia, Moldova, Oman, Panama, Peru, Dominican Republic; before July 16 for Kosovo, Montenegro, Serbia; before August 13 for Colombia);

S) married/civil partner/direct descendant under 21 years of age/descendant or direct ascendant/family member resident in Italy and dependent on a national of one of the States listed under Q);

T) to enter Italy for reasons of health, work, study or absolute urgency or for the return to their home, dwelling or residence, not having transited or stayed, in the last 14 days, in one of the following countries: Armenia, Bahrain, Bangladesh, Bosnia Herzegovina, Brazil, Bulgaria, Chile, Colombia, Kosovo, Kuwait, North Macedonia, Moldova, Montenegro, Oman, Panama, Peru, Dominican Republic, Romania, Serbia

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# Covid-19

## General rules

### PROTECTIVE BEHAVIOUR TO ADOPT



Wash your hands frequently



Cough or sneeze into your elbow or into a disposable handkerchief



Use a **disposable** handkerchief and throw it in the waste bin



Greet people **without shaking hands**, avoid embracing

### HAND DISINFECTION MUST BE CARRIED OUT THOROUGHLY



When arriving at the venue



On entering and leaving the toilet



Before and after using **printers**

### SOCIAL DISTANCING



To avoid catching the virus, **maintain a distance of at least two metres** from one another. This measure is highly recommended within your sub-group and mandatory with everyone else.



# Covid-19

## General rules

### GOOD HABITS TO ADOPT



Promote **digital document sharing** to avoid the transmission of paper documents



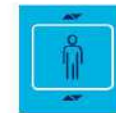
Wash or disinfect your hands **before and after handling any object that may be handled by someone else**



Disinfect your **workspace before and after working**



Share a car only with the members of your sub-group and wear a mask



Do not share lift with persons when not wearing a protective mask



Use individual water bottles or flasks



Do not share anything with your colleagues (equipment, bottles, cigarettes, etc.)



Touch stair handrails and door handles **as little as possible**



Use a disinfectant wipe and clean objects in communal areas before touching them



Wear protective equipment and follow **airline/airport safety rules** when you travel



In the hotel, stay in the FIA dedicated areas



Keep interactions to a minimum



Limit crossing paths with people in corridors; wait until they have gone past.

Frequently, Thoroughly, & with Soap and Water
- SOCIAL DISTANCING**  
Maintain at Least a 3 Feet\* Distance!  
Facetime Your Friends Instead
- AVOID EYE, NOSE, & MOUTH TOUCH**  
Contaminated Hands Transfer Viruses to Parts of the Body
- IF SICK, STAY HOME**  
If Fever, Bad Cough, or Breathing Issues Arise, Seek a Medical Professional
- STAY EDUCATED, & FOLLOW HEALTH ADVICE**  
Keep Up with COVID-19 Updates!  
Follow Professional Health Advice Given By Employers, Healthcare Providers, & Local/National Public Health Authorities
- MAINTAIN RESPIRATORY HYGIENE**  
Cover Your Sneezes with an Elbow or Tissues, and Dispose the Tissues After

\*Other public health authorities suggest a minimum distance of 6 feet.

**Wash your hands**

Wash your hands with soap and running water when hands are visibly dirty

If your hands are not visibly dirty, frequently clean them by using alcohol-based hand rub or soap and water

## Protective measures

**Protect others from getting sick**

When coughing and sneezing **cover mouth and nose with flexed elbow or tissue**



**Throw tissue into closed bin immediately after use**



**Clean hands with alcohol-based hand rub or soap and water after coughing or sneezing and when caring for the sick**

### HOW TO WEAR A NON-MEDICAL FABRIC MASK SAFELY

#### Do's →

- Clean your hands before touching the mask
- Inspect the mask for damage or if dirty
- Adjust the mask to your face without leaving gaps on the sides
- Cover your mouth, nose, and chin
- Avoid touching the mask
- Clean your hands before removing the mask
- Remove the mask by the straps behind the ears or head
- Pull the mask away from your face
- Store the mask in a clean plastic, resealable bag if it is not dirty or wet and you plan to re-use it
- Remove the mask by the straps when taking it out of the bag
- Wash the mask in soap and detergent, preferably with hot water, at least once a day
- Clean your hands after removing the mask

#### Don'ts →

- Do not use a mask that looks damaged
- Do not wear a loose mask
- Do not wear the mask under the nose
- Do not remove the mask where there are people within 1 metre
- Do not use a mask that is difficult to breathe through
- Do not wear a dirty or wet mask
- Do not share your mask with others

A fabric mask can protect others around you. To protect yourself and prevent the spread of COVID-19, remember to keep at least 1 metre distance from others, clean your hands frequently and thoroughly, and avoid touching your face and mask.

### HOW TO WEAR A MEDICAL MASK SAFELY

#### Do's →

- Wash your hands before touching the mask
- Inspect the mask for tears or holes
- Find the top side where the metal piece or stiff edge is
- Ensure the colored side faces outwards
- Place the metal piece or stiff edge over your nose
- Cover your mouth, nose, and chin
- Adjust the mask to your face without leaving gaps on the sides
- Avoid touching the mask
- Remove the mask from behind the ears or head
- Keep the mask away from you and surfaces while removing it
- Discard the mask immediately after use preferably into a closed bin
- Wash your hands after discarding the mask

Remember that masks alone cannot protect you from COVID-19. Maintain at least 1 metre distance from others and wash your hands frequently and thoroughly, even while wearing a mask.

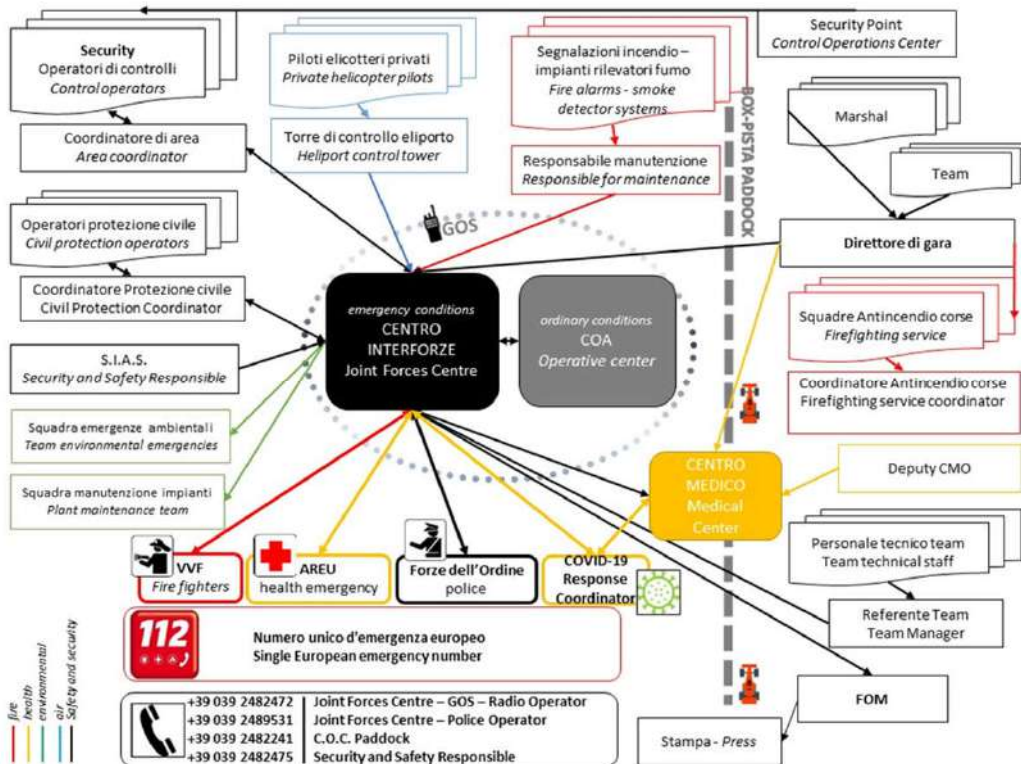

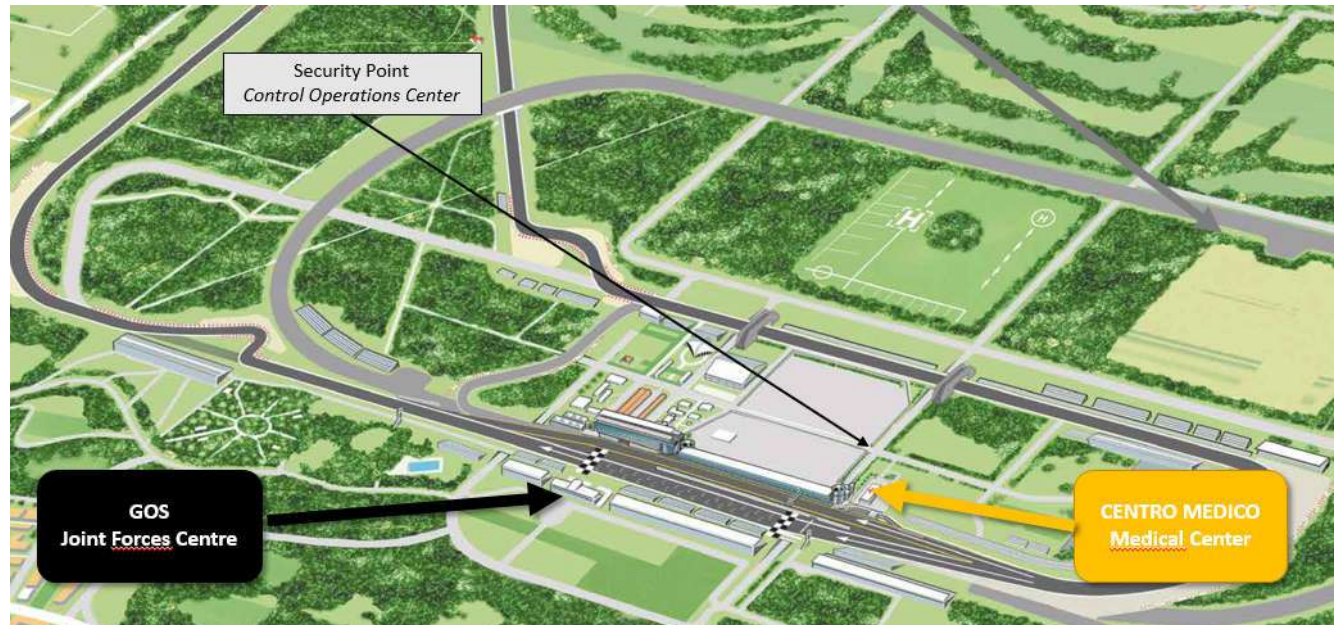
## Paths and parking





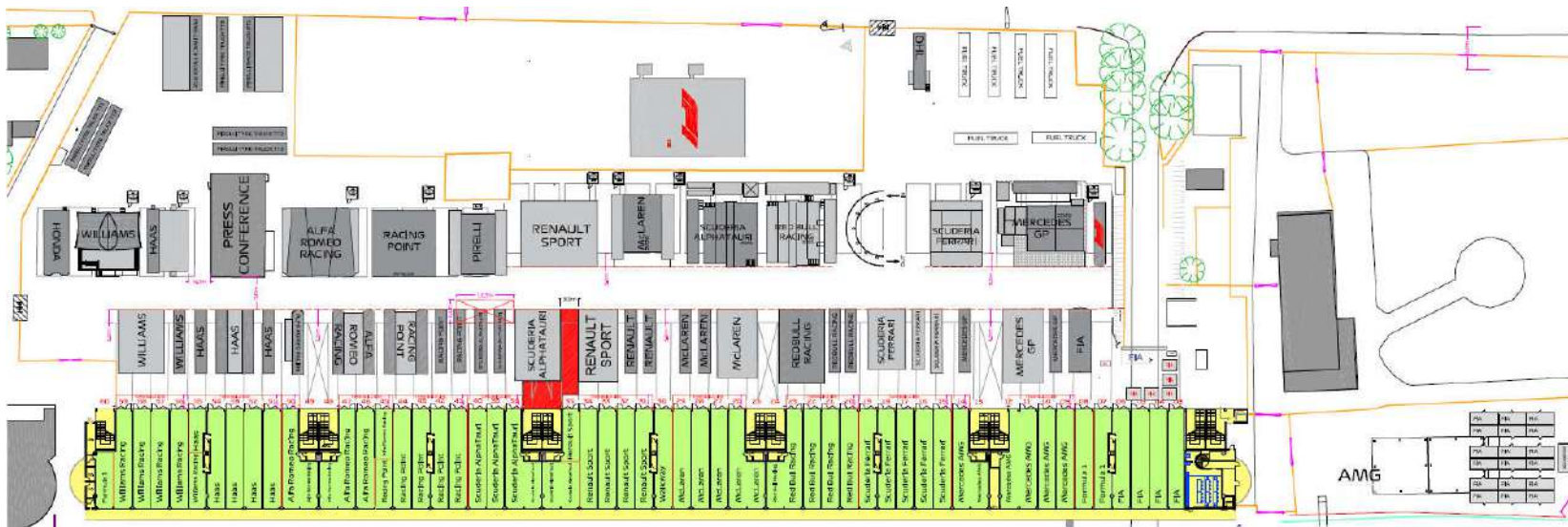
